## PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

At the completion of this lecture, the learner will be able to:

- 1) Explain in basic terms how pacemakers function to pace and sense the heart; describe the NBG pacemaker code; list the most common pacing modes and understand the main rationale for selecting each mode; list problems that may be encountered when managing pacemakers and ICDs during the perioperative period; understand the effects of placing a magnet over a pacemaker and ICD; describe a feasible and safe strategy for managing pacemakers and ICDs during the perioperative period.
- 2) Understand the CMS Interpretive guidelines on changes in Sedation Practice; modify existing policy and create new policy to ensure compliance.
- 3) Understand American Heart Association's new Advanced Cardiac Life Support updated 2010 recommendations.
- 4) Recognize the importance of Teamwork Training for critical event responders in the hospital.
- 5) Case presentations with discussion and direct involvement of participants to enhance the learning experience.
- 6) The need for measuring outcome in anesthesiology and how data capture and benchmarking can improve outcomes; understand the role of Anesthesia Quality Initiatives in facilitating these efforts.
- 7) Understand the pathophysiology of hemorrhagic shock and the purpose and practice of resuscitation; understand how early support of the coagulation system can improve outcomes.
